New Zealand “Medallists” at the Australian National Athletics Championships

The following tables list the New Zealand athletes who won “medals” at the Australian National Athletics Championships for Senior athletes since the 1961-62 season. I have used the word “medals” somewhat reservedly as I am led to believe that in some years New Zealand athletes were not awarded a medal as such. The placing was acknowledged, but the corresponding medal was awarded to the Australian competitor!

The venue and date of the Senior Championships is also listed. Where New Zealand athletes won a medal at an Australian National Championship event that was held separately to the main National Championship, then this is also stated.

In some years, particularly the early years, I have been unable to find if any New Zealand athletes actually competed at the Australian National Championships and have therefore left these years out of the booklet.

The first time that Senior men and Senior women were at the same championships was in 1972 in Perth. The next time was in Melbourne 1976, then Brisbane 1978 - after which both Senior men and Senior women competed each year at the same championships. –


